The undersigned Affiant being first duly sworn, hereby swears or affirms that AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CERTAIN PROPERTY AS HISTORIC PROPERTY recorded on February 24, 1987 in Book 1592, Page 1361, Forsyth County Registry, by the City of Winston-Salem contained the following *typographical or other minor error*:

The names of the owners of the property at the time of Local Historic Landmark designation were not included in the Ordinance.

Affiant makes this Affidavit for the purpose of correcting the above-described instrument as follows:

The Forsyth County/Winston-Salem/Kernersville Historic Properties Commission recommended that the Main Post Office Building be designated as a historic property. The owner of the Main Post Office Building on February 19, 1987, when the City of Winston-Salem designated said Local Historic Landmark, was the United States Postal Service.

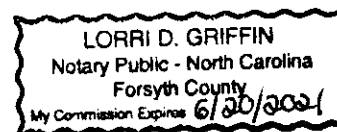

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING CERTAIN PROPERTY AS HISTORIC PROPERTY

WHEREAS, all of the prerequisites to the adoption of this ordinance, as prescribed by Chapter 160A, Article 9, Part 3B, of the North Carolina General Statutes, have been met; and

WHEREAS, the Forsyth County/Winston-Salem/Kernersville Historic Properties Commission has submitted a report, which is incorporated herein by reference, and recommended in a joint public hearing that the property described below be designated as a historic property; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Aldermen finds that the property described herein is of historical, architectural, and/or cultural significance, and its preservation should be encouraged;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of Winston-Salem as follows:

Section 1. The following described property is hereby designated historic property:

Main Post Office Building, located at 101 West Fifth Street in Winston-Salem and being Lot 13, Block 24 as shown on the Forsyth County Tax Maps.

Section 2. The waiting period provided by law shall be observed prior to demolition, alteration, remodeling or removal of the designated property.

Section 3. This ordinance shall be effective from and after its adoption.

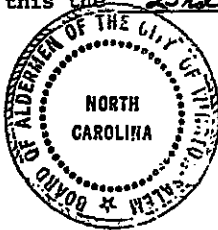
